The Fundació Joan Miró

The Fundació Joan Miró was created by Miró himself, at first principally with works from his own private collection, with a desire to set up an internationally recognised centre in Barcelona for Miró scholarship and contemporary art research, and to disseminate the collection. The Fundació opened to the public on 10 June 1975 and has since become a dynamic centre in which Joan Miró's work coexists with cutting-edge contemporary art.

With an interdisciplinary approach, the Fundació organises temporary exhibitions of 20th and 21st century artists as well as academic activities and projects in collaboration with other institutions and organisations. Through its exhibition and educational programmes, the Fundació Joan Miró explores lines of research linked to the work of Miró and to contemporary art.

The Fundació is located in a building designed by Josep Lluís Sert, making it one of the few museums anywhere in the world in which the complicity between artist and architect underpins the dialogue between the works and the space that houses them. The Fundació offers an overview of the landscapes of Joan Miró's art and life, creating an enriching dialogue with other artists from the 20th and 21st centuries.

Affinities. Joan Miró, his cities, his artist friends

Exhibition Concept

Affinities is an exhibition that revolves around four cities that are key to understand Joan Miró's life and work, namely Barcelona, Paris, London, and New York. Not only were those art centers important for the development of his career, but they were also the sites where Miró established important connections and where lifelong friendships were born.

Affinities is divided up into four sections corresponding to each one of these four cities. It highlights a series of dialogues between Joan Miró and some of the most prominent artists from these contrasting art scenes who befriended him as peers or younger followers. Each one of them, in one way or another, had a special connection with Joan Miró, leading to an ongoing mutual correspondence which this exhibition wishes to bring to light.

The works gathered in this project show the affinities between these artists and Miró. Their bonds arose not only through friendships or the social or cultural encounters that Miró had with them, but also out of a commitment to art that he shared with emerging talents, even those from whom he was separated by both a generational and a geographical distance.

Other points of convergence in this selection of works become apparent in the interest shown by all featured artists towards so-called primitive art and the influence it exerted on their output; the importance of materiality and the rise of gestural and action art; the prominence of black and darker palettes; as well as the inclusion of everyday objects, to name just a few of the most salient features that connect their works with those of Joan Miró. Sometimes the affinities between Miró and those artists are deliberate or evident. In other instances, they are subtle, almost unconscious. In all cases, however, they are the result of a significant mutual mirroring based on which those artists evolved and were regenerated.

Content of the Exhibition

Works featured in the Exhibition

The works included in this exhibition are part of a special section of the Fundació Joan Miró collections which was compiled under the name *Tribute to Miró*. These works were donated by their authors and received by the museum after Joan Miró's death in 1983. It was at that time that the Fundació Joan Miró in Barcelona decided to create a special collection of works by some of the most relevant artists from the twentieth century, and in such a way honour Joan Miró's expressed desire to offer an overview of international art in his museum.

Following that wish, the first group of such works was assembled in 1986, partly thanks to generous gifts from some of the artists featured in the exhibition, their heirs, or from important private collections.

In addition to those special holdings, beginning in 2007, the Fundació Joan Miró started assembling another special collection based on works by artists awarded with the Joan Miró Prize. This biennial distinction is granted to contemporary artists whose output and careers stem from the same spirit of exploration, innovation and social engagement that characterized Joan Miró's life and work. The winners of past editions have generously donated works that have helped expand our collections as further examples of the continued links between Miró's legacy and contemporary artists. In view of this, *Affinities* includes some works by winning artists Pipilotti Rist, Mona Hatoum and Ignasi Aballí, as a way of broadening the time span of the project and bringing it to the present.

Artists in Dialogue

The exhibition combines eighteen paintings, bronzes, and lithographs by Joan Miró with prominent works by 27 other artists. Together, these dialogues include a range of techniques, from painting, sculpture, and object art, to prints, photography and video installations.


